

Credit Student Characteristics, Fall 2016

Overview

Established in 1926, College of Marin (COM) is located approximately 15 miles north of San Francisco in Marin County. The College consists of two campuses. The Kentfield Campus is located in Central Marin; the Indian Valley Campus is located in North Marin.

The Kentfield Campus is located on 77 acres of land. The Indian Valley Campus is situated on 333 acres of land. The College employs 355 permanent staff and faculty and many part-time employees.

The College offers more than 40 degree programs leading to an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree. Over 20 Certificates of Achievement with various specialties are offered. The College has established over 200 articulation and transfer agreements with the University of California, California State University, and private colleges.

The College serves approximately 9,000 students each term. Approximately 5,800 students enroll in COM's credit program. About 1,300 students enroll in free noncredit English as a Second Language classes. Approximately 1,900 enroll in community education classes. Some students enroll in both credit and noncredit classes to meet their goals.

Program Overview

College of Marin offers credit, noncredit, and fee-based courses. Noncredit courses and fee-based courses are short-term, not given for credit, and not graded. For information on COM's fee-based classes, please consult the community education schedule or call 415.485.9305.

Courses that can be applied towards a degree or transfer to another college are offered through COM's credit program. Many services such as counseling, financial aid, and job placement are available. Student characteristics in this report are for the <u>credit</u> <u>program only</u>. There are 5,572 credit students enrolled in 896 classes for fall 2016. The majority of students attend College of Marin part-time.

In fall 2016, 896 credit classes are being taught at College of Marin; 729 (81.4%) classes are at the Kentfield Campus and 167 (18.6%) classes are at the Indian Valley Campus. Classes are offered in the daytime and evenings and on Saturdays. Classes are taught in a variety of formats including lecture, lab, distance education, and work experience.

Educational Goal

The College offers more than 40 undergraduate majors in humanities/liberal arts (AA degree), science (AS degree), and technical and vocational areas (AS degree or Certificates of Achievement).

Students update their educational goal each semester when they enroll in classes at the College.



Gender


The College's credit student population is composed of 41% men and 58% women. (One percent of students did not report this information.)

Most College of Marin students are Marin residents (82%). Of the remaining 18% the majority reside in San Francisco, the East Bay, and Sonoma County. The number of foreign students attending COM on a student visa is 54.



Fifty-one percent of the College's credit students are 25 years of age or older. The median age of credit students is 25 years. For full-time students, it is 20 years; for part-time students, it is 28 years. The youngest student is 12 and the oldest is over 80.
