

## Overview

College of Marin offers community education classes that are fee-based, short-term, not given for credit, and not graded.

There are a wide variety of subjects offered in the *community education* class schedule such as art, foreign languages, music, physical fitness and more.

These community education classes are offered during day, evening and Saturday hours. Please refer to the community education class schedule for a listing of classes or call 415.457.8811.

The College serves about 1,900 community education students each term. The enrollment for fall 2018 in the community education program was 1,918 students.


## **Geographic Location**

Most College of Marin community education students reside in Marin County (96 percent). The majority of the remaining students reside in San Francisco, the East Bay, and Sonoma County.

## Age of Students

Ninety-five percent of the College's community education students are 30 years of age or older. The median age of community education students is 66 years; the youngest is 13 and the oldest is over 90.



## Gender

The College's *community education* student population is composed of 19 percent male and 66 percent female. Fifteen percent of students did not report this information.
