

Overview

College of Marin offers community education classes that are fee-based, short-term, not given for credit, and not graded.

There are a wide variety of subjects offered in the *community education* class schedule such as art, foreign languages, music, physical fitness and more.

These community education classes are offered during day, evening and Saturday hours. Please refer to the community education class schedule for a listing of classes or call 415.457.8811.

The College serves about 1,500 community education students each spring term. The enrollment for spring 2018 in the community education program was 1,423 students.

Geographic Location

Most College of Marin *community education* students reside in Marin County (96 percent). The majority of the remaining students reside in San Francisco, the East Bay, and Sonoma County.



Gender

The College's *community education* student population in spring 2018 was 17 percent men and 62 percent women. (21 percent of students did not report this information.)

Age of Students

Ninety-one percent of the College's community education students in spring 2018 were 30 years of age or older. The median age of community education students was 68 years; the youngest is 19 and the oldest was over 90.
